Main Street with unmatched views
of the Blue Ridge Mountains.
Waynesboro proper is surrounded
by some of the most beautiful
outdoor space in the eastern United
States.

Waynesboro has maintained a small consistent growth of new residents moving into the city. The population has reached 21926 with a population growth rate of 0.4% in the last year and 6.2% in the last 5 years. Living in Waynesboro has a suburban feel, which can be nice for families looking for more space than larger densely packed cities for the money and a good area to raise children.



You'll find more than 100 scenic overlooks and nearly 700 miles of hiking trails in the region. The town is a well-known stop on the Appalachian Trail, where thruhikers can stop for recuperation and supplies. It's a growing mecca for hikers, campers, trail runners, paddlers, mountain bikers and anglers, who can spend endless weekends exploring the area's trails and rivers.

Waynesboro is easily accessible from Interstate 64, and it has increasingly become a home base for outdoor enthusiasts. And you can have all of this just outside your back door!






WAYNESBORO HAS A LOW COST OF LIVING FOR VIRGINIA.



It has been inhabited in some form since the 1700s, but the community really took off in the 20th century. As a result Waynesboro real estate consists of a mix of family homes, townhomes, and condos built in the last 100 years, with the odd Colonial home thrown into the mix. Properties in the older neighborhoods tend to be grand, boasting mature landscaping and majestic views of the Blue Ridge Mountains. For those who like the idea of luxury living in Waynesboro with the personal touch, there are plenty of lots left for custom building in desirable Waynesboro neighborhoods.



The cost of living in Waynesboro is moderate in the United States and low in Virginia. Median household income in Waynesboro is \$43,480, which is low in the United States and the lowest in Virginia.

TAXES

The sales tax rate in Waynesboro is 5.3%. Last year, the average property taxes paid was 0.7%. The Virginia income tax rate is currently 5.75% for incomes over \$17,000.

HOUSING COSTS

In Waynesboro, <u>59%</u> of the population owns their homes, while approximately 41% rent. The average cost of a single-family home in Waynesboro in 2022 is <u>\$228,951</u> which is moderate in the United States and moderate in Virginia. The average one-bedroom <u>apartment cost</u> is approximately \$720 per month, and the average apartment cost for a 3 bedroom is \$1,230.





02 CLIMATE

You'll enjoy all 4 seasons in Waynesboro from sunny summers to snowy winters with glorious bursts of spring and fall colors in between.

To be more specific, in a typical year, Waynesboro temperatures fall below 50F° for 162 days per year. Annual precipitation in Waynesboro averages 42.4 inches per year (high in the US) and snow covers the ground 22 days per year or 6.0% of the year (low in the US). It may be helpful to understand the yearly precipitation by imagining 8 straight days of moderate rain per year. The humidity in Waynesboro is below 60% for approximately 31.2 days or 8.5% of the year.

In Waynesboro, the shortest day starts at 7:41am and ends at 4:55pm and lasts for 9 hours 30 minutes. The longest day starts at 5:52am and ends at 8:42pm and lasts for 14 hours 48 minutes.







SAFETY

When considering a great place to live, work, and raise your family, safety is always a concern, and Waynesboro does not disappoint.

With a safety score 70.1 (with 100 being the best), Waynesboro makes the grade. Factors including air quality, water quality, crime rates, natural disaster frequency, substance abuse rates, cancer instances, and more were considered in the above rating. Let's break it down:

CRIME RATES

In Waynesboro, violent <u>crime rates</u> are considered to be moderate in the United States according to our research. Arson crimes are moderate and property crimes, including vandalism, also rank moderate.

AIR & WATER QUALITY

Waynesboro has great <u>air quality</u> 97.0% of the time, or 354 days per year. The water quality index in Waynesboro is 100 out of 100 (100 being the best) based on the number of acute health-based <u>violations</u> for every water utility in the last 5 years.

04 EDUCATION

When determining the quality of schools, we consider key factors including math proficiency, reading/language proficiency, students-per-teacher ratio, average teacher salaries, National Blue Ribbon awards, Spelling Bee and STEM/non-STEM national competitions, and more.

The public schools in Waynesboro make the grade with above-average rankings overall and high proficiency ratings in both math and reading/language arts. All the schools boost a lower-than-average teacher-to-student ratio. Check out the chart below for more details:



The top industries present in Waynesboro include educational services and health care. Over 33 % of residents work in management, business, science, and arts occupations, while only 7.6% work in natural resources, construction, and maintenance occupations. Waynesboro earns an Industry Diversity score of 64.9.

Some of the top retail outlets include companies we know and love including Walmart, Target, Lowe's, Starbucks, McDonald's, Kroger, Kohl's, Sherwin-Williams, Dollar General and Bed Bath & Beyond, and T.J. Maxx, but there are many specialty and unique shopping opportunities in the area.

Waynesboro supports a well-educated workforce and community with 53.8% of residents having earned a Bachelor's degree or higher, compared to the U.S. average of 46.6%. Nearly half of those holding degrees (47.1%) hold STEM degrees. The Educational level Diversity score in Waynesboro is 77.3.

The top age group is 25-44 per census data. Waynesboro has a Race Diversity score of 23.


O7 ARTS AND CULTURE ARE ABUNDANT

expressions.



O8 AWESOME LOCAL RESTAURANTS, CRAFT BEER, AND COFFEE

From Waynesboro's historic downtown to the bustling Rosser Avenue, there are many appealing places to eat and drink. The Green Leaf Grill is a relaxed fine-dining restaurant that makes its American and Cajun fare from scratch, including delicious gumbo, steak entrees, po-boys, and Reubens. Jake's Bar & Grill is a welcoming, family-friendly spot that specializes in locally raised beef burgers. They are known for their down-to-earth vibe and feature a discount (and sign-in log) for hikers. Coffee drinkers will enjoy the upbeat atmosphere and tasty beverages, breakfast, and lunch from The French Press. Beer lovers are well cared for in Waynesboro, too. Local breweries include **Basic City Beer** (in a reclaimed industrial complex), Stable Craft Brewing (on a beautiful working farm), and Seven Arrows Brewing Company (inspired by a Native American blessing).








10 COUNTLESS THINGS TO ENJOY
